Fair Housing is Your Right!

Fair housing is the right to rent, buy, or finance housing free from discrimination. People who are looking for housing should only be considered based on qualifications, such as ability to pay or rental history. If you have been treated unfairly because of your...

... when renting or buying a home, getting a mortgage, obtaining housing insurance, seeking housing assistance, or in other housing-related activities, then you have experienced illegal discrimination.

Housing discrimination is against the law.

Discrimination is not always obvious and can take many forms. It may happen when a landlord refuses to rent you an apartment, tells you it is unavailable when it is vacant, steers you toward a different location, or if the terms and conditions of your lease are different from those of the landlord's other tenants. Illegal discrimination can also happen in advertisements.



Home Matters

Housing is a basic need that we all share. Access to good quality, safe, and affordable homes is critical to individual and family stability and health. It determines our ease of getting to work, where our children go to school, access to healthcare, and what kind of physical environment we live in. Having enough quality affordable homes for everyone also promotes economic growth and wellbeing. Communities that welcome a diverse range of residents are more vibrant, resilient, and help fulfill the promise of equal housing opportunity for all.

Housing in Vermont

The state has a housing shortage and before the COVID crisis, more than a third of Vermonters were paying 30% or more of their incomes on housing, with more than half of those paying 50% or more. The pandemic has only made this worse. Meanwhile, Vermont has the oldest housing stock in the country and at least 19,000

households live in homes with serious quality issues. And although many of the state's thousands of people experiencing homelessness were able to access tempory lodging during the pandemic, there is not a long-term solution. In this tight housing market, people of color, people with children, people with disabilities, LGBTQ+, and others face a higher risk for discrimination.

April is Fair Housing Month

Each April we celebrate the 1968 passage of the Fair Housing Act with a series of public education and art events to raise awareness about housing discrimination in Vermont and the positive role that inclusive, affordable

> housing plays in thriving communities.
